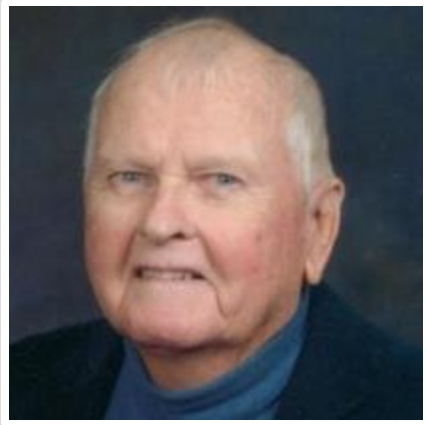




Carl Leroy Davis
