Anderson-Ralph Maurice McCoy, 90 of Anderson passed away September 11, 2010. Son of Earl and Daisy Bone McCoy, he was born in Wells County September 22, 1919.

He married Ethel Timmons Eglen in 1960. He graduated in 1938 from Rock Creek High School. Inducted into the Huntington Sports Hall of Fame in 1975. He was a pitcher in many leagues including the Toledo Mud Hens. He was a referee and umpire officiating throughout the state of Indiana.

Mac spent over 27 years serving his community. He served as Assistant Street Commissioner and as Park Superintendent. He built Derby Down, a soapbox derby track. He was instrumental in improving the Grand View Golf Course, Old Clubhouse, Westside Community Center, Athletic Park and was the force behind the purchase of Shady Side Lake. He served as Governor of the Moose Lodge. Mac and his wife, Ethel owned and operated McCoy's Ice Cream Shoppe in Chesterfield.

Preceded in death by his wife, Ethel; his parents; five brothers and three sisters; stepson, Larry Eglen and niece.

Mac is survived by twenty nieces and nephews; and honorary "family" Fred and Marcia Stephenson.
