people traveling from all over, not only for the products, but for the warm conversations and welcoming atmosphere Thomas and Shirley created. Thomas never met a stranger and made countless acquaintances and lifelong friends through the years.

In 1991, Thomas fulfilled a lifelong dream by building his own RV-4 airplane, which he proudly flew for more than 20 years. Aviation became one of his greatest passions, and he loved traveling to communities and airports throughout Indiana with Shirley by his side. The two enjoyed flying together for breakfast, lunch, or dinner, making cherished memories along the way. He was a proud member of the local Experimental Aircraft Association club and deeply enjoyed the friendships and camaraderie that came with it.

Above all, Thomas will be remembered for his kind heart, gentle spirit, and the love he shared with his family and friends throughout his life. He treasured time spent with those he loved and created countless memories that will forever be held close by all who knew him. His warmth, wisdom, and caring nature touched many lives.
